ProtonPals is open to cancer patients with tumors of all types and for those interested in proton radiation therapy



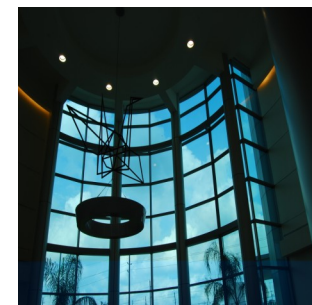

As you complete your treatment many questions will arise. First of all you have the big question "Am I Cured?" Next you will be wondering about what side effects you may encounter. Then perhaps you are asking when will I be able to resume my normal activities and when do I see the doctor for a follow-up exam. The list of questions will likely grow as you leave the Proton Therapy Center.

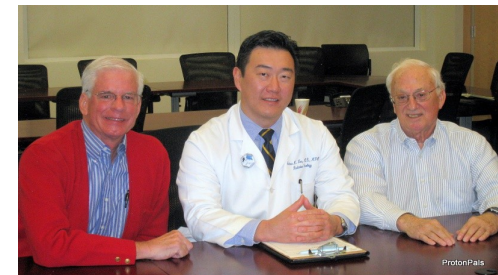
